3rd LIXIL International University Architectural Competition:

12 Universities from 11 Countries Submit Proposals for Sustainable Architecture

Based on the Theme of a "RETREAT IN NATURE"

Announcing the Three Finalists:

Best Work to be decided on, April 20, Sat. (Plaza Hall, Kasumigaseki Building)

The LIXIL JS Foundation (located in Koto-ku, Tokyo; president: Yoichiro Ushioda), which undertakes surveys and research related to the housing and building materials industry, as well as supporting the development of human resources, is actively engaged in the search and verification of next-generation sustainable housing. "The LIXIL International University Architectural Competition" was established by the foundation in order to inform the wider public of technological developments in the field. Total of twelve entrants from eleven countries submitted proposals. Following an impartial screening of documents, the jurors selected three universities to continue to the next round of the competition:

Based on the theme of "RETREAT IN NATURE" and designed for a site in Memu Meadows (Taiki-cho, Hokkaido), the 3rd LIXIL International University Architectural Competition accepted proposals from twelve designated universities from eleven different countries. In addition, for the first time in the history of the competition, each participating university is publishing its research related to the theme on Facebook. By sharing views and values related to a variety of environments rooted in specific climates and cultures, the participants developed their ideas to realize a proposal for a new kind of sustainable architecture. Serving as the chairman of the open final screening is the internationally active architect Kengo Kuma. Kuma has received a great deal of attention for his involvement in the *Ginza Kabukiza* (jointly designed with Mitsubishi Jisho Sekkei), which has recently opened after the

conclusion of the fifth phase of reconstruction. Also on the jury is Tomonari Yashiro, a doctor of engineering and professor at the University of Tokyo, who also served as a judge in last year's competition; and Darko Radović, who oversaw *Barn House*, a proposal by a group of Keio University students that was awarded the prize for best work in the second competition.

On April 20 (Sat), 2013, the open final screening will be held publicly at Plaza Hall in the Kasumigaseki Building (Chiyoda-ku, Tokyo), and one of the three universities will be selected as the competition winner. The winning submission will then be built on the site in Memu Meadows.

Situated on a site in the Memu Meadows of Hokkaido's Taiki-cho, We seeks sustainable architectural solutions from nominative universities around the world.

The winning university will be responsible for the project throughout the construction phase.

♦Memu Meadows

What are the challenges we must face in order to achieve a truly prosperous society? With regard to housing, the problem is related to energy efficiency, biomass, the realization of a low-carbon society, interior environment control, and the verification of earthquakeresistant structures. In order to address these issues, Memu Meadows: Center for Research on Environmental Technologies, was opened in Taiki, Hokkaido. The site of the Research Center used to be farm land, where the existing housing and facilities were renovated and refined to maintain the memory of the place. Taiki, with its harsh winter, is a fertile land of transient seasons. The name



of land, Memu, eloquently signifies a place where the fountain springs. On this land, together with the Center's participants, we would like to search for a truly comfortable and hospitable living environment.
